Is humankind running out of time to take action to prevent a climate, social, and economic catastrophe or it is so uncertain that we don't have to worry??

This is the second Stony Brook Great Debate held this academic year, hosted by the Humanities Institute. The Debate moderator is Jim Klurfeld of the School of Journalism. The debate brings together an oceanographer (Malcolm Bowman), an ecologist and conservationist (Carl Safina), a journalist (Elizabeth Bass), an urban planner (Lee Koppelman), and an economist (Elaine Kamarck) to further debate perhaps one of the greatest questions facing humankind.

Whatever the future holds, what are the scientific, political, economic and public awareness issues that need to be debated, shared and brought into sharp focus?
