I am happy to report some good news concerning the DVD Why Are We in Afghanistan?

- It has just won the Studs Terkel Prize for Media and Journalism from the Working Class Studies Association.
- It was selected into the Reel Works Labor Film Festival in Santa Cruz, Calif.
- A Teacher Guide is now available for free that shows how to use the DVD to meet state and federal standards in social studies.
- The New York Teacher (City Edition), publication of the United Federation of Teachers (AFT Local 2), representing over 100,000 members, has published a review encouraging teachers in New York City to use the DVD. The review characterizes the DVD as "useful and comprehensive," "sober, professionally done and fact-filled," and "partisan but also scrupulously fair." We hope that the DVD and Kit will play a wider educational role now that the New York State United Teachers (NYSUT) convention has passed a resolution calling for the immediate start to the rapid, orderly, and full withdrawal of all US military and contractors from Afghanistan, and for an educational campaign among its membership.
