Objectives: This seminar will review and update medical providers on selected topics which impact the female patient. Emphasis will be placed on common office problems, e.g. infertility, ovarian failure, stress urinary incontinence, uterine fibroids and endometriosis. The series will be clinically oriented, but will include basic pathophysiology as well as new technologic advances as they pertain to the gynecologic patient. Upon completion of the course, participants should be able to describe current recommendations in the care of the female patient including: evaluation and treatment of patients with infertility, ovarian failure and uterine anomalies, evaluation and treatment of patients with an abnormal pap smear, dysfunctional uterine bleeding or genital prolapse. The information will be relevant to a wide variety of practitioners, including family medicine, internists, pediatricians and surgeons.
